

HOW TO KNOW WHETHER WHAT YOU ARE RECEIVING IS ACTUALLY FROM THE SUPREME COMMITTEE FOR DELIVERY AND LEGACY (SC)?

TAKE RESPONSIBILITY

Any correspondence with individuals and companies alleging to represent the SC's Procurement & Contracts Department shall be done at your own risk. The SC shall not be held liable for any loss or damage, direct or indirect, incurred as a result of this act.

CHECK THE SC WEBSITE

Active open tenders will always be available on the SC website and/or on the Ministry of Finance's website, and continuously updated as new tenders go live and old ones are closed off.

DOUBLE CHECK THE EMAIL ADDRESS

The email address approaching any bidder will always end with @sc.qa. Any other email address is fraudulent and does not represent the SC. This should be the first step any bidder checks to ensure the authenticity of the information they receive.

CHECK THE TITLE

A valid tender will always be on SC letter head, and contain only the SC logo, and never affiliated with any other logo or entity. The address to submit a tender will always be Al

Bidda Tower.

DON'T PAY UNNECESSARY FEES

The SC will never request any fees to register as a supplier on our supplier registration portal.
